I have obtained from the Clerk and enclose for your reference a copy of the Last Will and Testament of Glenn A. Abbey and the Inventory of his estate. As you will see, the trust for Mr. Abbey and the sisters provided income for life, and then the principal of each share was to be distributed to the two nephews and nieces.

In addition, you may remember that Mr. Glenn Abbey left a hand written list of instructions to June directing her to send one set of silver to Robert Anderson and one set of silver to Wilber, and in addition to send certain silver trays to them. I don't have a copy of the hand written list so I can't remember exactly what it said.

I do recall that although the income distributed, which probably would have been about \$60.00 per month, was more then than now, but still not very much, that it caused some problem, perhaps with Aunt Maude, with reference to qualifying for State Aid or some other government payment. But, my memory is that she did something to solve the problem. Of course, Aunt Edna died so soon after Glenn did that the Trust for her share was never established.
